Known primarily for his work in philosophy and the visual arts, dn rodowick is also an accomplished experimental filmmaker, video artist, and curator. Rodowick's moving image works are primarily concerned with process and performance in ways that explore fluid relations between stillness and movement, figuration and abstraction, and the inscription of time in space. Rodowick also makes multiscreen installation work with sculptural elements and print media including, photographic prints, cyanotypes, and unique edition artist books. Although conceptual in nature, Rodowick's moving image work embraces affect through its hypnotic rhythms and haunting, painterly beauty. His more recent work investigates how remediations of images under different temporal aspects may affect our perception of time and processes of memory and forgetting. He is currently producing a series of new works inspired by sites of thinking in the history of philosophy, the first of which, *Plato's Phaedrus* and *Agora, or things indifferent*, premiered in Berlin at the Arsenal Institute for Film and Video Art in 2017.
